Mount Takao (Takaosan)

Yakuo-in Temple

Founded in 744 by Gyoki on the order of Emperor Shomu. Yakuo-in grew under the patronage of the ruling Tokugawa family during Edo period (1603-1867).

Edo-Tokyo Open Air Architectural Museum

A showcase featuring buildings of historically and culturally significance dating from the early Edo to Showa eras (1650s-1950s) that have been relocated and rebuilt.
